

Annual Assessment Report for Academic Programs



Residents are trained in all aspects of management esturgical and surgical management of periodontal diseases. Residents are required to pass 20 clinical competencies as outlined in the program(Eightr(8) non surgical periodontal therapy two each of the following: including periodontal exam and treatment plan, scaling and root planning, periodontal revaluation and periodontal maintenance; ten (10) periodontal and implanted surgical procedures including the following: osseous resective surgery, soft tissue surgery, dental implant placement and dental provisionalization.).

Outcomes for the procedures described above coincide with required resident performance skills outlined in the Commission on Dental Accreditation (CODA) standards for the Advanced Dental Education Program in Periodontics. Performance rated for each applicable outcome area are listed in an End of Course Report form. The report is reviewed by the Division the semested for in completed course during a scheduled school ide Curriculum Review session.

Residents are evaluated daily, seminually and annually by the faculty and program director. The benchmark for daily performance/evaluations is based on a minimum level conference of G, A, S. (G = Goal sed daily performance)
